The Gifts Of Christ: We have access to the LORD by His grace.

Rom. 5:2 through Whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand. And we boast in the hope of the glory of God. (NIV)

Before Jesus came and became our sin-debt offering, there was no access to the Father for us. Only the high priest had access to the presence of God, and that was once a year with great trepidation.
