Ex. 33:18-20, "Then Moses said, "Now show me your glory." And the Lord said, "I will cause all my goodness to pass in front of you, and I will proclaim My name, the LORD, in your presence. I will have mercy on whom I will have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I will have compassion. But," He said, "you cannot see My face, for no one may see Me and live."

We pick up from where we left off yesterday as we continue to hear the dialogue between the LORD and Moses on Mt. Sinai. I find it encouraging that Moses wanted to be closer to God than ever before and asks to see the LORD's glory. The LORD answers him and speaks words of power: "I will cause all my goodness to pass in front of you, and I will proclaim My name, the LORD, in your presence."

Can you imagine what this must have been like? Can you imagine the emotions that must have been running through Moses's mind and heart? He was speaking with the LORD, and realizing that would have brought great reverence and fear. In fact, it was so forceful that the countenance of Moses was changed so greatly, that when he returned to the people, they couldn't even look at his face because it shone with God's glory.

Oh, that the glory of God would be seen on our faces. What a difference it would make if people truly saw the glory of the LORD in our lives. When He is lifted up, He will draw all people to Himself. Let's lift up the LORD in the presence of the people so that they can see Him and live!

Dear LORD, we want to see You. We want to experience Your presence today. Help us to show others Your amazing love and power. You are so awesome beyond description. We exalt You. In Jesus Name, Amen.
