2 Cor. 5:8, “We are confident, I say, and would prefer to be away from the body and at home with the LORD.”

Read through this passage with that in mind: **John 14:1-6** **“Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in Me. My Father’s house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with Me that you also may be where I am. You know the way to the place where I am going.”** Thomas said to Him, **“Lord, we don’t know where you are going, so how can we know the way?”** Jesus answered, **“I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me.”**
