The Lord wants you to experience real and abundant life:

James 4:8 Come near to God and He will come near to you. Wash your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded. (NIV)

Abiding in Christ is also pictured here by James. It is first put into motion by our choice. We must choose to put Him upon the throne of our lives. He will never force Himself upon anyone.
