The Lord wants you to experience real and abundant life:

Rom. 8:31-32 What, then, shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He Who did not spare His own Son, but gave Him up for us all--how will He not also, along with Him, graciously give us all things? (NIV)

When we are talking about full and abundant life, we must initially realize that not everyone has or experiences this kind of life. As I have stated before, *most* people just exist. And as Paul shared with the churches in Galatia, Gal. 2:20b The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, Who loved me and gave Himself for me. (NIV)

Dear LORD, I'm so glad You are for us. And because of this, no one can stand against us because of You. You paid the price to redeem us as Your own. Help us to now walk in the new life You have given us. In Jesus Name, Amen
