The Lord wants you to experience real and abundant life:

Dt. 32:4 He is the Rock, His works are perfect, and all His ways are just. A faithful God who does no wrong, upright and just is He. (NIV)

(NIV) We can have great assurance that our lives will be protected and pure when we build them upon the foundation that will never crumble or fail.

I recall when we lived in the Houston area, the soil there was so sandy and full of clay that most of the houses in the area had foundation issues that were costly to repair. The soil was continually moving and cause large cracks and shifting of the foundations. This caused much damage, and it was important when buying a house, to make sure the foundation had been properly poured with beams that went down to the bedrock. What are you building your spiritual house on? Works? Church attendance? Service? Or are you building upon the solid rock of Jesus and a real relationship with Him?
