The Greek term for abundant life is **zoen perisson** which means *to not just exist, but to live life in an exceedingly, fulfilling and wonderful experience*. I wonder, are you just existing or are you truly experiencing life, moment by moment? It is the Lord's desire for us to live and not just exist. He has come to give us real life.
