Ps. 19:9 The fear of the LORD is pure, enduring forever. The decrees of the LORD are firm, and all of them are righteous.

The fear of the Lord is pure. What does that phrase mean to you? First of all, we can know that this word fear is not a panic or being afraid so as not to come close to God.
