Did you know that God loves you more than anyone else could ever love you?

God proves His love to you by His guarding love. Yesterday's verse also says **Psalm 121:8** ***"The LORD will guard your going out and your coming in from this time forth and forever."***

The Hebrew word for guard is yishmar which means to diligently keep, guard, protect, and observe as a watchman. Yesterday, we saw that the Lord is able to watch over you to keep you secure. This is a similar word found in Psalm 121 and it carries with it the connotation of a father watching over his children. There is a profound connection in this verse as it pertains to our Heavenly Father and His watch-care over His children. To be a child of God brings so much into one's life. We have His blessings, inheritance, favor, and especially His ability to guard us. The evil one hates us and he hates God. He is ever trying to attack. He wants to kill, steal and destroy. But my fellow believers, he will fall short because we have a Father Who is on guard for us. He knows every attack and He will watch over us, guard us, and even give us strength to stand in times of trouble. What a comforting thought this is to those who know Him.

You can count on the fact that nothing will ever escape His knowledge and ability to protect you. He is standing guard over you no matter where you are or where you've been.
